

CITY OF TRUSSVILLE MINUTES

AUGUST 31, 2021 SPECIAL SESSION

The City Council of the City of Trussville met in **special session** on **Tuesday, August 31, 2021** at 6 pm at Trussville City Hall, with Council President Alan Taylor presiding over the meeting and City Clerk Dan Weinrib serving as recording secretary.

Council President Taylor called the meeting to order.

Mayor Buddy Choat and Councilor Lisa Bright were absent.

The City Council reviewed the proposed agenda and routine business matters. They moved all routine business matters to the Consent Agenda section. Upon Council President Taylor's request, Councilor Short moved and Councilor Anderson seconded the motion to accept the agenda as presented. **UNANIMOUS** Councilor Cook moved and Councilor Anderson seconded the motion to accept the consent agenda as presented. **UNANIMOUS**

The Consent Agenda is as follows:

- Allow the Police to Send Out Invitations to Bid a Painting Services Contract on Its New Training Facility, formerly Sheepdog
- Hire Albert Williams as Public Works Skilled Laborer (Grade 12 – Step 4), effective Sept 7, 2021
- Hire Justin McCurdy as Parks & Recreation Skilled Laborer (Grade 12 – Step 2), effective Sept 11, 2021
- Hire Joy Spurlin as part-time Recreation Unskilled Laborer (Grade 7 – Step 1), effective Sept 11, 2021
- Hire Ann Sargent as Library Circulation Assistant (Grade 12 – Step 1), effective Sept 11, 2021
- Reassign Parks & Recreation Seasonal Pool Supervisor Mary Howell to part-time Gymnastics Coach (Grade 5 – Step 1), effective Sept 1, 2021

President Taylor opened a public hearing regarding a proposed vacation of a public street. Since nobody spoke up, he promptly closed the public hearing.

Councilor Short then introduced a proposed resolution to vacate a portion of Linden Street. The resolution would also authorize the City to enter into an easement agreement with the city utilities board. He moved and Councilor Cook seconded the motion for its approval. **UNANIMOUS. Resolution No. 2021-43**
