Ordinance No. 2023- \$\phi 2\frac{7}{2}\$ -ADM

An Ordinance Changing the Name of a Public Street to Chalkville Mountain Road & Re-Establishing Its Point of Beginning

WHEREAS, there is a dispute among government entities over the correct, proper & legal name of a public road; and

WHEREAS, generations of citizens within and beyond Trussville, Alabama have always referred to the section of County Road or Route 10, between Sweeney Hollow Road and Interstate 59, as Chalkville Mountain Road; and

WHEREAS, the Unites States Postal Service already delivers envelopes and packages addressed to "Chalkville Mountain Road" to various physical locations; and

WHEREAS, the addressing division of Jefferson County Development Services expressed its willingness to resolve the street name dispute in accordance with the wishes of our community

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Trussville, Alabama, as follows:

- **Section 1.** That the entire public road currently known as "Chalkville Road" within the city limits shall be changed to **Chalkville Mountain Road**; and
- **Section 2.** That **Chalkville Mountain Road** is hereby re-established as beginning at the western end of the I-59 bridge, extending in a west & northwesterly direction to the municipal corporate limits; and
- **Section 3.** That in the event of any future annexation along this public road, its city address shall have the **Chalkville Mountain Road** street name for E-911 purposes; and
- **Section 4.** That this Ordinance shall serve as the City of Trussville's petition to the Jefferson County Commission, to enact its own matching street name change. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file an enacted copy immediately with Jefferson County Development Services and the Jefferson County Commission.
- **Section 5.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the City Council of the City of Trussville, Alabama which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.
- **Section 6.** If any part, section, or subdivision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to invalidate or impair the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect not withstanding such holding.
- **Section 7.** That this Ordinance becomes effective immediately upon adoption, approval and publication as provided by law.
