

**An Ordinance Declaring Certain Real Property Owned By the City of Trussville as Surplus**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Trussville, Alabama (“City”) is presently the owner of certain real property consisting of approximately 230.06 acres commonly known as Glendale Farms (the “Property”);

**WHEREAS**, Section 11-47-20 of the Code of Alabama (1975) permits real property that is not presently needed for a public or municipal purpose to be declared surplus and to be disposed of through conveyance; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TRUSSVILLE, ALABAMA**, as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby declared surplus and established that the Property, more particularly identified in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto is no longer needed for a public or municipal purpose.

Section 2. Pursuant to the authority granted by Section 11-47-20 of the Code of Alabama (1975) the mayor of the City of Trussville, Alabama is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate an agreement of purchase and sale in the name of the City of Trussville, Alabama to effectuate the sale of the Property.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption, approval, and publication as required by law.
